Incident Activity March 26- April 1st

Monday, March 26

Berthoud Fire responded to the Berthoud Living Center for a medical.

BFPD was dispatched to the Berthoud Living Center for a medical.

Berthoud Engine 1 was dispatched to the 3400 block of Curlew Drive for a medical. TVEMS assumed patient care and the crew assisted with loading of the patient for transport.

Tuesday, March 27

Citizen assist to install a car seat out at Station 2. The mother of the child did the final installation of the car seat. The crew then told her to contact Berthoud Fire if she had any more problems or questions.

Wednesday, March 28

Car seat installation at Station 2. Also provided further information on installation and manufacturer recalls.

Berthoud Fire responded to the Berthoud Living Center for a sick person.

Thursday, March 29

BFPD responded to I-25 mm 249 SB for a single pick- up truck that had rolled over. Upon arrival found a single vehicle accident with heavy damage and 1 patient was transported. The crew assisted Colorado State Patrol with traffic control while the flatbed truck loaded the vehicle.

Friday, March 30

Larimer Cty Sheriff requested Engine 1 to stage on 4th Street for a taser victim. The patient was cleared and Engine 1 cleared scene and went available.

Citizen assist in the 900 block of Welch Avenue. The crew assisted the homeowner with replacing 2 smoke detectors in their high ceilings.

Berthoud Engine 2 was dispatched to the north campground of Carter Lake for an unattended camp fire. Upon arrival located the fire, the fire was put out properly by the camper. All units cleared and went available.

Sunday, April 1

Berthoud Fire responded to a grass fire in the block of 115th Street and Ish Reservoir. Upon arrival located a cottonwood tree on fire and had already fallen. The property owner stated he lit the fire so he could place piping in the ground. He was informed that he was unable to burn anything greater than 3" in diameter and the fire had to be attended. The cottonwood was 5' to 6' in diameter, the fire was quickly extinguished by E-16. Dispatch was notified that the tree was going to continue to smolder through the night. The homeowner was to keep an eye on the fire and to call if anything changes.

BFPD responded to the 1100 block of Jefferson Drive for a medical. TVEMS assumed patient care Squad 11 cleared scene.

Berthoud Squad 11 was dispatched to the 1600 block of Hollyberry Street for chest pains. TVEMS assumed patient care and the crew assisted with loading of the patient for transport.
